Attendance and Punctuality Letters

You will also have received a letter about your child's attendance this year, telling you if their attendance was **Good**, **Low**, **Poor or Very Poor**. We expect all children to attend for at least 96% of the time. Children should ONLY be absent if they are too ill to be in school.



Good = 96% or more

Low = 90-96%

Poor = 80-90%

Very Poor = less than 80%

Children also need to be in school on time. Class doors close at 8:55. If children arrive after this time, they miss out on learning that they really need. Please make sure children arrive on time.


